Aetherius together with Virgilius Bishop of Artes, consecrated Augustine as Bishop at Arles on November 16th, 597 AD; He later became the First Archbishop of Canterbury.

"Polycarp also was not only instructed by apostles, and conversed with many who had seen Christ, but was also, by apostles in Asia, appointed bishop of the church in Smyrna, whom I also saw in my early youth, for he tarried [on earth] a very long time, and, when a very old man, gloriously and most nobly suffering martyrdom, departed this life, having always taught the things which he had learned from the apostles, and which the Church has handed down, and which alone are true. To these things all the Asiatic churches testify, as do also those men who have succeeded Polycarp down to the present time...The true knowledge is the doctrine of the apostles, and the ancient organization of the Church throughout the whole world, and the manifestation of the body of Christ according to the succession of bishops, by which succession the Church which is found everywhere." 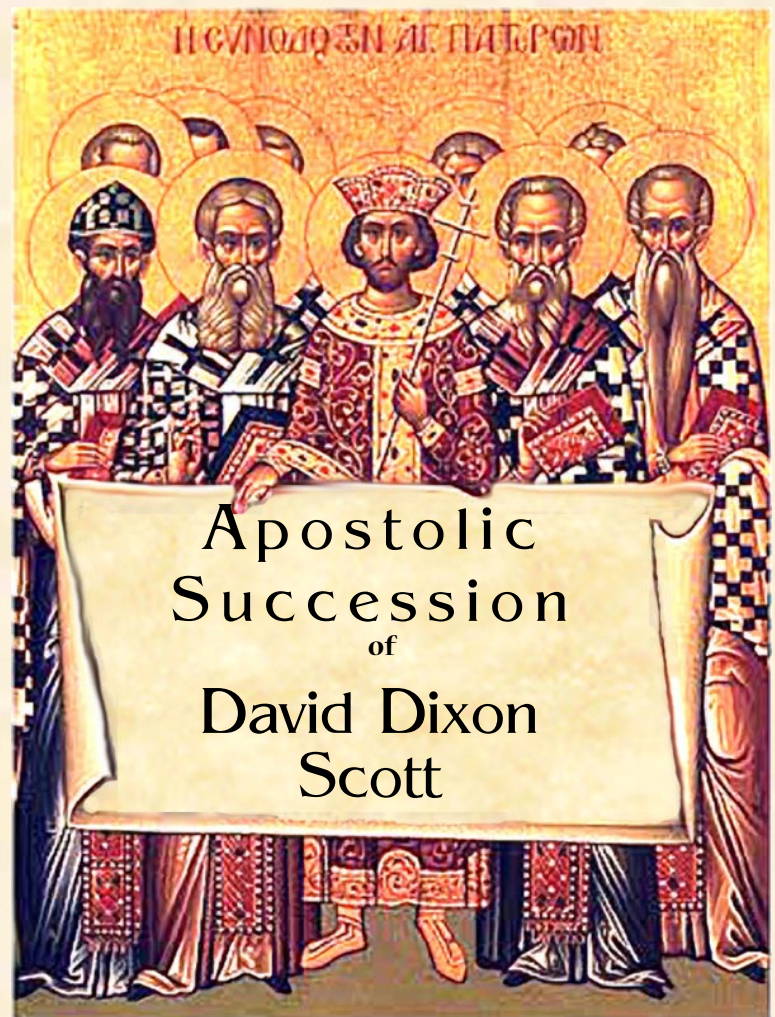

We commit you on this day of April 4, 2008, Holy Orders in the One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church; of your pious, sober, and honest life and conversation, knowledge of the Holy Scriptures, soundness in the faith, and competent learning, we are fully convinced: Also, having in our presence freely and voluntarily declared belief in the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be the Word of God and to contain all things necessary to salvation; having solemnly sworn to conform to the doctrine, discipline, and the worship of God in the Communion of Evangelical Episcopal Churches, under whose authority we hold our jurisdiction.

We then commit to you this special ministry of servanthood; to serve all people, particularly the poor, the weak, and the sick and the lonely. We charge you, by your words and in your life, to proclaim the Gospel and to love and serve Christ's people. Nourish them to the glory of God in this life and for the life to come. We commend you this day to take your place as a servant in Christ's One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church in the Communion of Evangelical Episcopal Churches.
